Publication Ethics and Malpractice Statement

The journal *Studii de lingvistică* is committed to meeting and upholding standards of ethical behaviour at all stages of the publication process. The authors, the editors, the peer-reviewers and the publisher have responsibilities to satisfy expected ethical standards.

Authors' responsibilities

To confirm that the article as submitted is not under consideration or accepted for publication in another journal. If portions of the manuscript overlap with published or submitted content, the authors have to acknowledge and cite those sources.

To provide a statement confirming that all the work in the submitted manuscript is original and that all authors have significantly contributed to the research. To acknowledge and cite content reproduced from other sources. To obtain permission to reproduce any content from other sources.

To notify the journal editor if a significant error in their publication is identified and to provide retractions or corrections of mistakes.

To mention if they got financial support for their research.

Editors' responsibilities

To handle submissions so that articles are considered and accepted only on their academic merit (importance, originality, clarity). Editors should have no conflict of interest with respect to articles they accept/reject. They have complete responsibility and authority to accept an article or to reject it if it does not meet the academic standards of the journal, it does not harmonise with its aim and scope or does not satisfy the authors' guidelines.

To handle the peer-review process. Each paper is sent to two independent reviewers. The evaluation process being double blind, the anonymity of the reviewers and that of the authors is preserved. When needed a third reviewer is asked to give his/her opinion on the manuscript. The editor decides to accept/reject it according to these reviews.

To ensure the integrity of the academic record by promoting publication of corrections or retractions when errors are found. To be willing to publish apologies when needed.

To publish guidance to authors on everything that is expected of them. To regularly update authors' guidelines.

To monitor and safeguard publishing ethics.

To constantly improve the journal by ensuring the quality of the articles they publish.

To provide guidelines for retracting articles.

Reviewers' responsibilities

To contribute to the peer-review process and to assist the authors in improving the quality of the published paper by reviewing the manuscript objectively. Reviewers should have no conflict of interest with respect to the research, the authors and/or the research founders.

To maintain the confidentiality of any information supplied by the editor/author.

To alert the editor to any published or submitted content that is substantially similar to that under review.

To point out relevant published work which is not cited in the manuscript.
